Stop the Confusion!

Dazed? Confused? Did symptoms begin when you considered bringing home outof-state swine to add new bloodlines to your breeding operation...or when you wanted to purchase a show or feeder pig from out of state?

Prevention = Protection!

Swine imported into Texas for breeding, feeding or show purposes must have an entry permit, issued by the Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC). This permit, valid for 15 days from issuance, is a special code that is to be

written on the certificate of veterinary inspection (health papers). For this free permit, call the TAHC at 1-800-550-8242, or the automated 24-hour permit line at 512-719-0777.

Swine entering Texas must have a certificate of veterinary inspection (health papers), issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days before the animals enter Texas. The veterinarian is to attest on the health paper that:

"these swine have not been fed garbage, were not vaccinated against pseudorabies, and weren't exposed to hog cholera or pseudorabies."

Refer to the charts in this brochure for additional specific

health paper requirements for each class of swine.

Entry regulations for swine protect Texas' herds from diseases. National disease eradication programs are underway for pseudorabies, a flu-like viral disease, and swine brucellosis, a bacterial infection. (Brochures about these diseases are available from the TAHC.)

Each state has a "status" in these eradication programs (see states' statuses on other side). Herds can also earn a status through a voluntary testing program. The status of the herd and/or state determine the pseudorabies and brucellosis entry requirements.
